
## a note from Tamryn.

We criss-crossed Ethiopia for Jesus and thank the Lord for guiding our steps and blessing this endeavour! You will be blessed in turn by the report that follows as you read what wondrous fruit your prayers and giving have produced. This newsletter also includes details of the crusades still to be held by In His Name this year: Gojo, Asella and Asosa, all Ethiopian towns. While restrictions on gatherings remain tight in South Africa but relaxed in Ethiopia, we will forge ahead winning souls for Jesus on mass in this East African nation.

## The book launch tour

Six towns visited, hundreds of pastors impacted

We held meetings in six towns in total—Gambela, Dire Dawa, Ziway, Shashamane, Shone and Arba Minch—with church leaders also joining the meetings from nearby locations. In each meeting, Tamryn preached a powerful message on the Holy Spirit and how to partner with Him in the miraculous. A dynamic time of ministry followed with hands being laid on every leader in attendance. Thereafter, the books were distributed to eager recipients in a little ceremony that included Tamryn signing each copy and our team awarding it. A short report follows for each town visited.





# Gambela

We began our tour in Gambela, a town in the far west of Ethiopia where we crusaded in May 2017. It is located around 50km from the South Sudanese border. We spent two days in this town, meeting with the Amharic-speaking evangelical church leaders on the first day and the Anuak-speaking leaders on the second day. The Anuak tribe is found both in South Sudan as well as the Gambela Region of Ethiopia. We also met with a representative from the three refugee camps that are located nearby the town and inhabited by the Nuer people who have fled the war in South Sudan. Books were given to him to give to the pastors in these camps. We will—Lord willing—hold a Gospel Crusade in each camp at the beginning of 2022.



# Dire Dawa


Dire Dawa is a predominantly Muslim city of half a million inhabitants in the far west of Ethiopia. With less than 3% of its population being born-again believers, it is not permissible for Christians to hire the local stadium for an event. We gathered with close to two hundred evangelical pastors in the largest church in the city and had a power-packed, Spirit-saturated time with them. We have entered into discussions to hold a Gospel Crusade on a permitted ground early next year. In addition to our meeting with the pastors, Tamryn ministered in one of the churches on the Sunday morning. Samuel, our Crusade Director, journeyed the 50km south to Harar, the fourth holiest city of Islam to minister there and distribute books. Books were also sent to pastors in Jijiga, a pivotal town that sits close to the Somalian border.



# Ziway



We crusaded here in December 2018 and were warmly greeted. The churches exploded with growth after our crusade and each involved congregation had to plant multiple new branches that continue to thrive. How fantastic! We met with pastors and representatives from the twelve denominations that make up the evangelical fellowship in Ziway. Two pastors from Asella also joined us—where we will crusade later this year—and received books to take back to their fellow leaders. They are extremely excited about the upcoming crusade, as are we.









# Shone







# Arba Minch




